SD&B: What are we looking at here?

## DIABLO TANGO

(60" H x 48" W x 48" D, Stainless Steel)

This is the cornerstone piece for a new series I am creating. This series is inspired by breaching dolphins in the gulf and the intertwining dance of the tango. This individual piece has a darker, futuristic arsenal - best viewed at night on the beach in a lightening storm. Crash...BOOM!

Future Tango series works will be in excess of 12 feet in overall height.

## CONTINUUM

(14" H x 12" W x 10" D, Stainless Steel on an aluminum base)

This is an expression of free energy. A limitless recurring flow of reflection and Power.

SD&B: What are you trying to accomplish, generally, with your art?

I want my work to inspire others to do what they love to do, maybe even what they have not had the courage to attempt before. My hope is that you will see and feel the Power - the energy in each piece.

SD&B: What inspired you to take this path?

Introduced to the fusion of metals at an early age, I became fascinated by design. I completed my bachelor's degree in engineering from Purdue University.

Most of my artwork has an industrial dimension, based upon experiences in the machine tool and aerospace industries. Metal has to burn and sparks must fly in creating my unique designs.

SD&B: What are some examples of recent or important commercial, private and/or public applications of your work?

I have completed works for both the private and commercial sector, from private clients in New Jersey and Chicago to a Sheraton hotel in California. Several galleries represent my work. My next goal is permanent public art and commercial art on a large to monumental scale.
